Eagle Scout Scholarship

Emil Gundelfinger was a rancher and farmer, a pioneer in many of the agricultural ways of today. He was a member of the Fresno Rotary Club. He helped to organize the Sequoia Council and was a charter member of the Council. He served as a Council Vice President from 1919 to 1922 and then as the Council President from 1922 to 1926. In July of 1926, he led a group of 16 Sequoia Council Eagle Scouts on a two-week trek from Mineral Springs to Mount Whitney. Along the way, they came across an unnamed mountain peak which later was named by Mr. Gundelfinger and endorsed by the Sequoia Council and the Sierra Club as Eagle Scout Peak. It stands at an elevation of 12,000 feet in Sequoia National Park.

This scholarship fund was established by his son Walt and his wife Fran Gundell.

The Award: is to be given yearly to one or more Eagle Scouts obtaining their Eagle rank in the Scouting America Sequoia Council.

Who is Eligible: Scholarship consideration will be given to Eagle Scouts who, upon graduating from high school, plan to attend a college or university of their choice and who plan to pursue a major in the Natural Resources Management and Conservation areas (Agriculture, Ranching, Farming, Husbandry, Soil and Water, Forestry, etc.).

Selection Process: A committee of not more than three members will be appointed by the Council President to select the scholarship recipients. The winners will be presented the scholarship at the Sequoia Council's Recognition Dinner each year.

Application Process: The candidate should complete the application being careful to secure the certification of:

- Unit Leader
- Head of Chartered Organization
- Parent or Guardian
- Sequoia Council CEO/Scout Executive

They should then submit the application and a copy of each of the following documents:

- Most recent school report card
- A letter of recommendation from a person outside of Scouting

Deadline: The application and all associated documents must be postmarked no later than December 31st. Send applications along with the other paperwork to:
